



NEW OPEN ACCESS PUBLISHING POSSIBILITIES: Smart Cities, Buildings, Sustainability, Buildings & Cities and Frontiers in Built Environment



Affiliation between CIB and MDPI

CIB and MDPI have partnered on an affiliation agreement specifically with three journals aligning with CIB members' broad built environment research portfolios. The journals are *Smart Cities*, <http://www.mdpi.com/journal/smartcities>; *Buildings*, <http://www.mdpi.com/journal/buildings>; and *Sustainability* <http://www.mdpi.com/journal/sustainability>. A conference proceeding option was also negotiated.

MDPI's journals are published in an open access model. Everyone has free and unlimited access and authors retain the copyright of their work instead of transferring it to the publisher. Open access publishing is supported by article processing charges which are paid by the author. A 15% discount will be given on *Sustainability* to all CIB members, and 10% discount for both *Smart Cities* and *Buildings*. Article processing charges are found on each journal's website. CIB conference meeting reports can be published for free in all three journals.

MDPI offers open access publications and a Proceedings series specific for conference outputs. MDPI publishes *Proceedings*, an outlet dedicated to making the output of conferences widely available. Each conference proceeding can be individually indexed, is citable via a digital object identifier (DOI) and freely available under an open access license. MDPI can also undertake to print and deliver a high-quality conference proceeding book for each

conference participant or arrange delivery as a branded USB stick. *Proceedings* is available online through the following search engines: Directory of Open Access Journals, EBSCOhost and MDPI Open Access Journals. The general charge would be € 23 / paper; papers over 9 pages would be an extra € 2 / page. English editing services are available for an extra charge. MDPI offers XML conversion for an extra € 28 / paper.
